



A Bachelor's degree is the first academic qualification and allows professional employment.

For those wishing to obtain further qualifications, it can be followed immediately or after a few years of professional experience by a **Master's degree**.

The students who want to have a career in research or to teach in the Higher Education Institutions may attend a **Ph.D. Programme**.

NUSTPB – Pitesti Branch

Degrees and Study Programmes - General Information

tudies at the **Pitesti Branch** are organized and implemented in the framework of the Bologna Declaration.



- **1.** The **Bachelor** Programme is completed in six/ eight semesters (3/ 4 academic years) and is worth 180/240 ECTS.
- **2.** The **Master** Programme is completed in 4 semesters (1.5/ 2 years) and is worth 90/120 ECTS.
- **3**. The **Doctoral** Programme degree (PhD) is completed in 3 academic years.
- Course attendance might be compulsory (50-100%) for some of the course units. Students are expected to participate actively and attend classes regularly.
- Students are usually required to take a final examination which can be either a written or an oral assessment, depending on the course.
- Attendance, assignments and class participation are also considered part of the final mark.

Certificates and grading systems

The Romanian Universities comply with the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS)

- 1 semester = 30 ECTS credits
- 1 full academic year = 60 ECTS credits.

Romanian Academic Grading System:







To obtain ECTS credit points and grades, specific tasks such as written/oral examination, internships, different coursework activities must be completed at the end of a course. An explanation of the grading system is included in the Transcript of Records given to every student.

The incoming exchange students will be awarded ECTS credits for each successfully completed course and provided with a Transcript of Records that will be sent to the International Office at their home institution.

Academic year

The academic year is divided into two semesters:

- 1. First (autumn) Semester: October-February
- 2. Second (spring) Semester: February-June



What is it?





RASMUS+ FOR HIGHER EDUCATION is the European Union programme for education, training, youth and sport, which runs from 2021 to 2027.

Each year, the higher education institutions can access Erasmus+ funding to support activities such as:

 international study/ traineeship mobilities for higher education short-cycle, foundation, bachelor, master and doctoral students.

> opportunities for academic and professional staff to teach or to be trained abroad.



* delivery of joint master degrees in collaboration with international higher education institutions, enterprises and partners to drive innovation, cooperation and excellence in higher education.

How can you become an **Erasmus+** Student in the **NUSTPB – Pitesti Branch?**



As an Erasmus+ student you can spend one or two semesters at the Pitesti Branch. The application procedure is slightly different if you come from a **programme country** or from a **partner country**.

Before applying you should inform yourself if your home university has an institutional agreement in place with the respective department at the Pitesti Branch. **Afterwards, you need to follow the necessary steps.**

Getting to know us:

If necessary, you will be able to opt for the modification of some subjects within the LA within 14 days from the beginning of the mobility.

Visa and Residence Permit



Visa

To find out all the information needed to obtain a visa, if it is required, please access the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, at https://mae.ro/en, section Visa and consular affairs.

A national long-stay visa

- allows the entry and stay of third-country nationals on the territory of Romania for a period that does not exceed 90 days. In order to extend this period, the third-country nationals shall apply at the Ministry of Internal Affairs -General Inspectorate for Immigration at least 30 days prior to the expiry of the validity of the long-stay visa.
- as granted only with the previous approval of the Ministry of Internal Affairs - General Inspectorate for Immigration.
- is commonly issued after 45 days.
- Long-stay visa applications for employment and secondment, which were previously endorsed by the Ministry of Internal Affairs - General Inspectorate for Immigration, are issued within 10 days since submission.

The Residence permit

After entering Romania, you shall obtain a residence permit.

It certifies your right to stay in Romania and you can get it from the local units of the General Inspectorate for Immigration in the county where you live.

In order to obtain a residence permit, you will submit personally a number of documents at least 30 days before the expiry of the right to stay granted to you by the visa.

You also have the possibility to submit the documents online at http://evisa.mae.ro/





In order to extend the right of residence (obtaining the residence permit) for medical treatment, you shall submit the following documents:

- application
- border crossing document (passport, travel document, etc.) original and duplicate
- a letter of acceptance from a public or private medical institution specifying the diagnosis and duration of the treatment
- proof of legal ownership of the living space (original and duplicate)
- proof of social health insurance (only for citizens older than 26)
- medical certificate.
- a document confirming the mobility issued by the Pitesti Branch
- a document confirming the existence of a valid inter-institutional agreement

The residence permit shall be renewed at least 30 days before the current visa expires. You should get a decision on your visa/ visa extention within 45 days since submitting the documents. In case further checking is required, the waiting time may be extended by 15 days.

Transport in Romania



Taxi

Taxi fees are affordable in Romania, at a price ranging between **0.5** to **1.0** Euro/km.

In order to avoid being charged excessively, always use official taxi companies; also, always ask for the meter to run and for a receipt at the end of your trip.

Note that taxi apps (Bolt, Uber) are now a popular way of ordering quality taxis.



Car

In Romania you will be required a valid driver's license. Romanian authorities recognize all licenses issued in the EU.

Gas is expensive (2.0 Euro/I), you will need a car insurance (the price is 200 Euro to 300 Euro); year, the annual tax and the road tax are to be paid too.



Train

You can travel around the country by train. For further details, please check https://www.cfrcalatori.ro/en/



Opening an account

În **Romania banks** are readily available in the entire country and we advise you to open a bank account when you arrive.

Necessary documents:

- passport
- accommodation proof
- letter of enrolment at university etc.

It is advisable to ask directly the bank of choice with regards to the exact documents.

The banks have a good ATM (automatic teller machines) network covering the country allowing you to withdraw money.

E-banking is also widespread and you can pay directly by card.

Romanian currency

The basic unit of Romanian currency is the Romanian LEU (LEI, plural) also known as **RON**.

Cost of living

As the general living costs are important for your financial planning, we provide below a list of common costs when you live in Romania.

Accommodation

Shared Rental - 80 Euro to 150 Euro/ month

Private Housing/ Rental - 130 Euro to 300 Euro/ month

On Campus dormitories - 60 Euro to 85 Euro/ month



Other living expenses

Food (canteen/ groceries/ eating out) - 100 Euro to 300 Euro/ month

Car maintenance (after purchase) - around 100 Euro/ month

Gas, Electricity - 100 Euro/ month

Phone and internet - 20 Euro to 40 Euro/ month

Medical insurance - from **12** Euro/ month (either private or at CNAS - The National Health Insurance company, state owned)

Public transportation - 10 to 30 Euro/ month

National transport - a train / bus ticket fare (300 Km) - 15-20 Euros

Entertainment - 150 - 200 Euro/ month

Climate and clothes

Romania has a temperate climate, with four distinct seasons, with **210** sunny days per year. You may thus enjoy the beauty of all seasons in Romania.



Spring (March, April, May) is very pleasant with cool mornings and nights and sunny days.

Temperature during the day: **6°** C in the morning and **20°**C in the afternoon.

Summer (June, July, August) is quite warm, with long sunny days.

The hottest areas in summer are the lowlands in Southern and Eastern Romania (35°C are in July and August).

The low level of humidity makes the temperatures rather bearable for the most part of the time. It is always cooler in the mountains.



Climate and clothes



Autumn (September, October, November) is dry and cool, with fields and trees producing colourful scenery. September, especially, is one of the best months to visit the country due to pleasant weather and lower prices for accommodation.

In winter (December, January, February) there are significant differences between various regions of Romania. It can be cold, especially in the mountains.

While not the rule, abundant snowfalls may occur throughout the country, from December to the first half of March.

Snow cover is continuous at higher altitudes from early December through early April.



Mobile phones

It is advisable to purchase a SIM card or Romanian mobile number when you arrive in Romania, as using your home phone number will incur high costs.

There are two types of mobile phone accounts you can choose from:

- prepaid
- subscription.



- **a) A prepaid service** gives you flexibility because you control how much you spend and can stop using the service any time.
- **b)** Nonetheless, you can also find good options if you choose **a subscription**. If you think that bureaucracy is annoying in Romania, note that getting a phone contract is very easy, and you can sign one on the spot at most mobile phone company branch offices.

Welcome to Argeş County and its surroundings



If you want to visit the world famous **Dracula Castle**, you are not far. It takes only **2 hours** if you leave Piteşti and the scenary is great!

Arges ranks the second country in the country in terms of forested area; in the north of the county there are the highest mountain range in Romania (the Făgăraş group), separated by the Rucăr-Bran corridor.



In order to reach **Bâlea Lake** mountain complex with ski and snowboarding slopes, you may take the **Transfăgărăşan** listed as one of the best driving roads in Europe and the highest road in Romania.

Getting to Pitesti

In order to reach Piteşti from Henri Coandă Airport Bucharest, we recommend private transport. The car costs 80 EUR/ one way. The cost will be divided by the number of passengers. Your private car will take you from the airport directly to the location you indicated in Piteşti.

For reservation, ask the Erasmus Office before your departure.

Another options would be a taxi from the airport (it could be a little expensive), the bus no. 780 or the train connection which reaches the North Railway Station in Bucharest. Then you will take the train to Piteşti.

If you want to get to Bucharest city centre from the airport to visit it, you should take bus no. 783. The tickets are to be paid in the Romanian currency - RON.

Bus

The main means of transport in Piteşti is the bus. A one-way ticket costs **2 lei**; it can be purchased from the Ticket Machines on the bus stations in the city or on the bus by credit card.

A two-way ticket costs **4 lei** and it can be purchased from the Ticket Offices in the bus stations. Moreover, you can purchase your ticket directly in the bus, using your Credit Card or you may have a monthly card.

- For any medical emergency students may call 112. Medical services are provided by the County Hospital, the Pediatrics Hospital, the Infectious Diseases Hospital and private clinics for all branches of medicine.
- The students from the EU countries, who benefit from Erasmus mobility grants or Non-EU students, have the insurance conditions stipulated in the application study documents.

- The insurance may also provide additional dental care, cosmetic surgery, etc.. Any detail about your health (allergies, intolerances, phobias, etc.) is of major importance in a possible emergency intervention.

Applicant

participating organisation or informal group that submits grant application. Applicants may apply either individually or on behalf of another organisations involved in the project. In the latter case, the applicant is also defined as coordinator.

(Application) deadline

final date by when the application form must be submitted to the National or Executive Agency to be considered eligible.

Certificate

in the context of Erasmus+, a document issued to a person having completed a learning activity in the field of education, training and youth, where relevant. Such document certifies the attendance and, where applicable, the learning outcomes of the participant in the activity.

Credit mobility

a limited period of study or traineeship abroad - in the framework of on-going studies at a home institution - for the purpose of gaining credits. After the mobility phase, students return to their home institution to complete their studies.

Credit

a set of learning outcomes of an individual which have been assessed and which can be accumulated towards a qualification or transferred t other learning programmes or qualifications.

Diploma Supplement

an annex to the official qualification documentation, which is designed to provide more detailed information on the studies completed according to an agreed format which is internationally recognized, a document accompanying a higher education diploma, providing a standardised description of the nature, level, context, content and status of the studies completed by its holder. It is issued by higher education institutions according to standards agreed by the European Commission, the Council of Europe and UNESCO. The Diploma Supplement is part of *Europass* (see below). In the context of an international joint study programme, it is recommended to submit a "joint diploma supplement" covering the entire programme and endorsed by all the degree-awarding universities.

ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System

a learner-centred system for credit accumulation and transfer, based on the transparency of learning, teaching and assessment processes. Its objective is to facilitate planning, delivery and evaluation of study programmes and learner mobility through the recognition of qualifications and periods of learning.

Learning mobility

moving physically to a country other than the country of residence, in order to undertake study, training or non-formal or informal learning; it may take the form of traineeships, apprenticeships, youth exchanges, teaching or participation in a professional development activity, and may include preparatory activities, such as training in the host language, as well as sending, receiving and follow-up activities.

Mobility/ Learning agreement

An agreement between the sending and receiving organisation, as well as the participating individuals, defining the aims and the content of the mobility period in order to ensure its relevance and quality. It can also be used as a basis for the recognition of the period abroad by the receiving organisation.

Partner Countries

countries which do not participate fully in the Erasmus+ Programme, but which may take part (as partners or applicants) in certain Actions of the Programme. The list of Erasmus+ Partner Countries is described in Part A of this Guide, section "Who can participate in the Erasmus+ Programme".

Programme Countries

EU and Non-EU countries that have established a National Agency which participate fully in the Erasmus+ Programme. The list of Erasmus+ Programme Countries is described in Part A of this Guide, section "Who can participate in the Erasmus+ Programme".

Receiving organisation

the organisation receiving one or more participants and organising one or more activities of an Erasmus+ project.

Sending organisation

the participating organisation sending one or more participants to an activity of an Erasmus+ project.

Staff

persons who, on either a professional or a voluntary basis, are involved in education, training or youth non-formal learning, and may include professors, teachers, trainers, school leaders, youth workers and non-educational staff.

Transcript of Records

a document that needs be presented, as part of the application process at the host university from abroad it consists basically of a list of the course units taken, the exams that were rassed and credits gained.
