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IV. SPEAKING (25 POINTS)

Stage 1 – Candidate Introduction

In the first stage, the candidate is invited to introduce themselves and provide very simple personal information. They can say their name, age, country or city where they live, occupation (student, pupil, etc.), family information (for example: “I have a brother”), as well as simple free-time activities.

The aim of this stage is to assess the candidate’s ability to produce very short and simple sentences about themselves, using basic vocabulary.

The following are evaluated: the use of simple sentences (such as “I am...”, “I have...”, “I live...”); correct use of the present tense; clear pronunciation; and short answers to simple questions.

Approximate duration: 1–2 minutes.

Example questions:

- *What is your name?*
- *How do you spell your name?*
- *How old are you?*
- *Where are you from? / Where do you live?*
- *What do you do? (Are you a student / do you work?)*
- *Talk about your family. Do you have brothers or sisters?*
- *What is your nationality?*
- *Where do you live? (apartment or house?)*
- *Do you like your city?*
- *What do you do on a normal day? (What time do you wake up?)*
- *What do you eat in the morning?*
- *What do you do in the evening?*
- *What do you do on Saturdays and Sundays?*
- *Do you like sports? What sport do you do?*

Or any other simple question adapted to A1 level.

Stage 2 – Information exchange

The candidate receives 5 keyword cards. After a short preparation time, they must ask simple questions in order to find out information about the interlocutor. It is not necessary to use exactly the words from the cards, but the idea must be kept.

Example: for the card “brother”, the candidate may ask: “Do you have a big family?”

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The examiner answers briefly and clearly to the candidate's questions and makes sure that the candidate understands the answers.

What is assessed: the ability to form simple questions (such as “What...?”, “Where...?”, “When...?”); use of basic vocabulary; clarity of expression.

Approximate duration: 2–3 minutes.

Stage 3 – Image description

The candidate receives a simple image and must say what they see.

The aim of this stage is to assess the ability to describe a very simple image using short sentences.

Instructions for the candidate:

Look at the image and describe it.

Say:

- where the people are
- how many people there are
- what the people are doing
- what they are wearing

The candidate may use simple sentences such as: “It is...”, “There are...”, “They are doing...”, “They are wearing...”.

What is assessed: use of simple sentences, basic vocabulary (people, clothes, actions), clarity of expression.

Suggested duration: 2–3 minutes.

Simple questions from the examiner:

- How many people are in the picture?
- Where are the people?
- What are they doing?
- What are they wearing?

The examiner speaks clearly and simply and repeats if necessary.
